CBA: CHRISTIAN RETAILING IS HOTTER THAN EVER

ATLANTA, Georgia--Next week the 40th annual International Convention of the Christian Booksellers Association (CBA) takes place at the Georgia World Congress Center. More than 11,000 delegates and 350 exhibitors are expected to revel in the summer heat because, as a CBA news release put it, "[the Christian retail industry] is hotter than Atlanta in July has ever been."

Sales of Christian books, music and other products are on a hot streak. According to CBA, sales should top the \$3 billion mark this year if the current 12% growth curve is maintained.

"Over the last decade, the worldwide Christian bookselling industry has grown by leaps and bounds," says CBA President and CEO William R. Anderson. "What was basically just a mom-and-pop industry only a few years ago, now is a serious worldwide industry."

CBA says that a segment of the business dominated by the youth market is "paramount in importance" to the growing industry. "Openness to the Gospel is unprecedented today," Anderson says. "Young people especially are looking for meaning in their lives. Consequently, our stores will be stocking more books and records for the youth of today."

Anderson reports that a large part of the youth market is reflected in an upsurge in sales of music and video cassettes, noting that music provides up to 30% of some stores' revenue. (According to CBA's most recent figures, music accounts for an average of 18% of sales volume in CBA-member stores. Twenty years ago, music accounted for less than three percent.)

The growth of the Christian retail industry is reflected in the growth of the CBA Convention itself. Since the first CBA show in 1950, it has grown from a handful of delegates and exhibitors to a show which ranks among the top 200 trade shows in the country. As a matter of fact, the Georgia World Congress Center was chosen as this year's site because it is one of a few centers in the U.S. which can handle the 300,000 square feet of exhibit space. In economic terms, the CBA convention is expected to inject more than \$16 million into the Atlanta economy.

The convention gets underway this Saturday night (8) with "A Night to Remember," a concert featuring hosts Hicks & Cohagan with artists Nancy Honeytree, Phil Keaggy, John Fischer, Phil Driscoll, the Bill Gaither Trio, the Gaither Vocal Band and Dino.

Glad, Babbie Mason and the choir from Atlanta's First Baptist Church will perform for the Sunday evening session with Dr. Charles Stanley. Numerous other artists will appear in concert or in "personality booths" during the week.

REUNION LAUNCHING MAJOR MICHAEL W. SMITH CAMPAIGN

NASHVILLE, Tenn.--Last month Michael W. Smith appeared on national television, landed his seventh #1 radio hit, began recording a Christmas record and made preparations for his fall "i 2 (EYE) Tour." Reunion Records is set to implement the largest marketing campaign in its history to support the tour, the Christmas album and Smith's 1988 release, *i 2 (EYE)*, which remains among the 10 current best-selling Christian albums.

"A big part of the fall campaign is directed toward achieving gold record status for Michael," said Reunion President Terry Hemmings. "We are well within reach."

In early June, Smith appeared on the "Children's Miracle Network Telethon," where he sang his classic "Friends." Also appearing on the telethon, which raised \$77 million, were the likes of Kenny Loggins, Debbie Gibson and Bob Hope. According to telethon talent coordinator Randy Beckham, "Michael's performance received, by far, the most telephone inquiries. This guy is going places."

Smith's Christmas album will showcase his talent in classical, worship and contemporary music. He is co-producing the album with Ronn Huff. Also appearing on the project will be the choir from Hollywood (CA) Presbyterian Church, the American Boy's Choir from Princeton, NJ and the Nashville Symphony and String Machine. The album, which is due for release in September, will feature some Christmas standards set to new arrangements and eight original songs co-written by Smith with such songwriters as his wife Debbie, Amy Grant and Gloria Gaither.

Also in September, Smith embarks on his 40-city, "i 2 (EYE) Tour" with Margaret Becker. (He did not headline a tour in support of *i 2 (EYE)* because he participated in the "Lead Me On Tour" with Amy Grant and Gary Chapman.) The tour runs from September 22 to November 19.

Elements of the marketing campaign will include various media materials, a pre-produced interview cassette, promotional tickets in selected markets for Christian radio giveaways, and in-store cassettes, tour poster and TV and radio appearances.

CHARISMA ANNOUNCES 1989 MUSIC POLL WINNERS

ALTMONTE SPRINGS, Fla.--*Charisma & Christian Life* magazine announced the results of its ninth annual reader's music poll in its July issue. The top 10 finalists were listed in the Male Vocalist, Female Vocalist, Group and Instrumentalist categories, while the top five were listed for Favorite Worship Album or Tape and Favorite Christian Music Video. For the second year in a row, the top four categories were won by the same artists. As usual, the results reflect an eclecticism which could only be possible in the Christian market.

Sandi Patti was named Favorite Christian Female Vocalist, followed by Amy Grant, Twila Paris, Margaret Becker, Kim Boyce, Debby Boone, Sheila Walsh, Leslie/Sam Phillips, Janet Paschal and Michele Pillar.

Carman was chosen Favorite Christian Male Vocalist, followed by Michael W. Smith, Steve Green, Russ Taff, Larnelle Harris, Michael Card, Steve Camp, Matthew Ward, Wayne Watson and Dallas Holm.

In the Favorite Christian Group category, Petra came

out on top. Other finalists (listed in order), were 2nd Chapter of Acts, Mylon & Broken Heart, First Call, Harvest (tied with Stryper), Imperials, Bill Gaither Trio (tied with White Heart) and BeBe & CeCe Winans.

Finalists for Favorite Christian Instrumentalist were (in order): Phil Driscoll, Dino, Phil Keaggy, Michael W. Smith, John Michael Talbot, Praise Strings, Chris Christian, Oz Fox, Greg Buchanan, and Rex Carroll.

Army of God and *Mighty Warrior*, both from Integrity's Hosanna! Music, tied for first place in the Favorite Worship Tape or Album category. Runners-up included *The Solid Rock*, also from Integrity's Hosanna!, *Hymns* (Vols. 1 and 2) by 2nd Chapter of Acts and *Make His Praise Glorious* by Sandi Patti.

"Lead Me On" by Amy Grant was named Favorite Christian Music Video, followed by *Live... Radically Saved* by Carman, *Sandi Patti Live* by Sandi Patti, *Find a Way* by Amy Grant and *Rock Solid: Absolutely Live* by DeGarmo & Key.

Along with the poll results, the magazine asked readers to share their opinions on whether such things as polls, charts and awards are appropriate from a spiritual standpoint.

* **Sandi Patti** once again sang for **President and Mrs. Bush** on June 20 at the "Charities Benefit Gala" at Washington D.C.'s Kennedy Center. She was accompanied by a 32-piece orchestra and the Emmanuel Baptist Church choir. Patti also appeared at **NewSound's** "Big Event" on June 24 and at **Creation '89** the day before. She and husband **John Helvering** told us they are expecting their fourth child in January. "We don't think it's twins this time," she

said, looking obviously relieved...

* We've heard about half the cuts from **Word's** forthcoming hymns product, and folks--trust us on this one--the Christian music market has got something very special here. *Our Hymns* features artists such as **Amy Grant, Take 6, Wayne Watson, Russ Taff, Kim Boyce, Petra, Phil Keaggy** and others doing hymns as only "our generation" could do them. We sense a blockbuster here...

* Well, it's festival season, and at least two festivals received more than their share of rain recently. **AtlantaFest '89**, which was held in mid-June at Atlanta International Raceway, was nearly rained-out for the second time in three years. Wet weather kept people away in droves. The "nation's largest Christian festival," **Creation**, suffered similar woes when a storm flooded out the mainstage area on opening night. The resulting mudbog made camping pretty uncomfortable for the 25-30,000 in attendance, but spirits and performances were good...

This list includes such personal favorites as Kim Boyce, Margaret Becker, Kenny Marks, and D&K. Other notables are Scott Wesley Brown, whose involvement with missions is wonderful; and Carman, whose ministry has encouraged multitudes with power-filled services and dynamic music.

So, when there seems to be negative shadows cast upon the current music industry, remember that God still has His 7,000 who have not bowed their knee to Baal. My sincere thanks to all of you who have held your integrity, and your hearts are in His hands. From one in Christ who is proud that you serve in His kingdom--God bless and keep on ministering!

FCCM NATIONAL CONFERENCE SET

NASHVILLE, Tenn.--New artist showcases, in-depth teaching, and concerts by several noted Christian artists are on tap for the 14th annual National Conference of the Fellowship of Contemporary Christian Ministries (FCCM), July 31-August 4 in Flat Rock, NC.

The five-day retreat at the Bonclarken Conference Center in the Smoky Mountains is expected to draw several hundred people involved in arts-related ministries.

The theme for the conference is, "Shifting the Arts Into the Future Tense: Creating New Possibilities for the 21st Century." Addressing that topic will be Dr. Tom Sine, noted author, Christian futurist and founder of the Creative Futures Center in Seattle.

Joining Sine as keynote speaker will be LaVerne Campbell, senior pastor of Calvary Chapel in Atlanta. Campbell's topic is "Healthy

Ministries in a Hurting World."

Other highlights of the conference include in-depth workshops and discussion sessions covering all aspects of contemporary Christian arts ministry, ranging from songwriting and electronic sound equipment to coffeehouse ministry, comedy, dance and mime. Workshop leaders include songwriters Dwight and Denise Liles; singer/songwriter Rob Frazier; writer Diana Cua; singer/songwriter Kim Patton; producer/arranger Rey Sanchez; coffeehouse director Pat Fogderud; choreographer Andrea Jobe; actor Bob Jobe; and actor/producer/coffeehouse manager John Wilson.

Showcases will feature up-and-coming contemporary artists, with feedback by a professional panel. (The FCCM invites artists to apply for showcases. Submission of materials is free, but a \$25 fee is required from those accepted.)

A variety of artists will perform in concert, including Rob Frazier, Tempest and the Azusa Street

Band. Also, the theatrical production *Toymaker's Dream* will be presented, featuring a 33-member cast of dancers and mimes.

Cost for the conference is \$195 per person, based upon double occupancy; \$330 for married couples; and \$80 for children four through 12. (Children three and under, free.) The four-night, five-day package includes all conference events, as well as lodging and meals. One-, two- and three-night packages are available at reduced rates.

PICKS OF THE WEEK:

DeGarmo & Key, *The Pledge* (Power Discs/Benson)
D&K's 12th release continues in the band's tradition of melodic, hooky rock and roll. "Boycott Hell" epitomizes their trademark anthemic power rock. They also continue to solidify their position as a valuable youth ministry with a distinct focus on challenging Christians to an active radical faith. Another winner for the duo from Memphis.

Deniece Williams, *Special Love* (Sparrow)
Niecy's second gospel market release sizzles with unstoppable energy. Instead of adopting a traditional, mellow approach, she stays with her funky, tight R&B sound. This is one hot release with exceptional players, performances and production.

Altar Boys, *Forever Mercy* (Frontline)

The Boys' fifth album continues their evolution from rough-edged garage punk to a sound heavily influenced by English pre- and post-modern bands. The tunes are commercial, melodic and authentic in nature.

Tom Brooks (Producer), *Come and Worship* (Alleluia! Music)
This is the debut in a new line of praise and worship releases from Integrity Music. The difference between this and the Hosanna! line is that the recording is done in a studio, without a worship leader and congregation. Guest vocalists include Kelly Willard, Matthew Ward, Annie Herring, Lenny LeBlanc and others. The lively, upbeat songs mix popular with new.

Edin-Adahl, *Big Talk* (Royal Music/Refuge)
This veteran Swedish band consists of two sets of two brothers. Their music is infectious pop-rock with R&B influences--similar to Huey Lewis. Try this on fans of Michael W. Smith and Morgan Cryar.

Mike Eldred, *Uncommon Love* (Home Sweet Home)
Eldred's debut solo album proves why he was a popular member with Truth. He is an experienced, emotive vocalist with strong songs. The sound is AC pop with a bit of R&B.

JC & the Boyz, *Never Give Up* (Broken)
The Boyz' first release highlights their more commercial brand of hip-hop/rap music. *Never Give Up* has all the rap amenities - scratching, a big beat, and seven bigger attitudes. The CD includes the music trax to two songs.

Graham Kendrick, *We Believe* (Star Song)
Kendrick is a veteran British artist and Europe's premier worship artist. His celebrative P&W songs range from lite AC to contemporary pop. However, the classy production makes this stand apart from typical praise releases.

Mastedon, *It's a Jungle Out There* (Regency)
This long-awaited debut album from noted producers John and Dino Elefante is a tribute to '70s arena rockers like Foreigner, Journey and Kansas. However, with four different lead vocalists and fluctuations between hard rock pop and grit, *Jungle* sounds more like a compilation album--which contributes to an identity problem. But all that aside, dinosaur rock aficionados and pop metalheads will love this.

Maria McKee, *Maria McKee* (Geffen)
This powerhouse performer's first solo album since the break-up of Lone Justice features a scaled-down approach. While McKee's emotional, intense delivery is still there, she leaves the high-energy rockabilly behind for a grab bag mix of roots music: folk, traditional country, torch singing, blues and gospel. Her songs are plaintive word pictures which are honest and certainly not destructive, but would not be classified as gospel.

Scarlet Red, *Don't Dance With Danger* (Pure Metal)
Debut album from this Nashville quartet of white metalers. The sound is straight-ahead hard rock with metal crunch and cliches. The look is totally glam, which may be a problem for some. Hint: the female lead singer is the one in the upper right corner.

PICKS OF THE WEEK:

DeGarmo & Key, "Boycott Hell" (Power Discs) CD
The boys hoist the picket signs on this debut rock release from *The Pledge*. The lyrical theme advocates an aggressive and active witness, as the mix showcases the trenchant guitar/synth exchanges the southern rockers are known for.

Twila Paris, "Sweet Victory" (Star Song) CD
Five cuts deep and still yielding prize radio cuts--this is Paris' fifth and final release from *For Every Heart*. Typically the artist finds joy and comfort in Christ's victory at Calvary as a mildly aggressive, but stately synth-track accompanies.

Noteworthy

Acappella, "To Be With You," b/w "To Win as Many as Possible" (Clifty) --On the A-cut the accomplished vocalists long for eternal fellowship with the Lord, amidst a multi-layered bass vocal bed. Here, the inspiring message carries the cut, as the vocal approach lulls in want of the upbeat sparkle of the troupe's debut radio release. The flip-side lifts the tempo just a nudge in its encouragement to believers "To Win as Many as Possible."

Bash 'N the Code, "More Than Enough," w/ "Cynic Clinic" (Star Song) CD --These are the debut cuts from Bash's debut Star Song release, and the band's first project sans the contributions of Greg and Rebecca Sparks. "More Than Enough" is an airy, synth-driven ballad which rejoices in Christ's sufficiency, while utilizing a tasty sax weave and the full choral contributions of Nashville's Christ Church choir. "Cynic Clinic" is an extremely quirky, Tayloresque rant on the problem of (ahem) critics in the Church.

Steve & Annie Chapman, "Where It All Begins" (Star Song) CD
The Chapman's continue their crusade for solid family values on this quietly sobering cut which tells of the effect a Godly parental example can have on a child. Soft but supportive soundtrack relies on gentle acoustic guitar and tempered synth charm.

David & the Giants, "Here's My Heart" (Giant) CD
From the band's *R U Gonna Stand Up* project comes a carefully paced ballad offering a life of total surrender. Synth accompaniment is propelled by a moderate percussion clip behind and expressive, open-hearted lead vocal. Debut release.

Graham Kendrick, "We Believe!" (Star Song) CD
International praise and worship artist Kendrick's shows his penchant for the congregational worship setting on this debut and title-release from *We Believe!* The artist is accompanied throughout with choral backing in this solid statement of Faith.

Tony Melendez (w/ Twila Paris), "No Other Like You" (Star Song) CD --Second radio release for Melendez stands a much better chance of breaking the artist on Christian radio. The pairing with Twila Paris is an obvious good move, but the song itself and the musical accompaniment should prove much more appealing to the Christian mainstream.

Mastedon, "Shine On" (Regency) CD Cut
Though chiefly known as a powerhouse rock act, Mastedon slows it down for this, modestly paced synth ballad. The cut's symbolism may force listeners to think a bit (ouch!) for the meaning, but it's worth the effort.

Wendy Swanson, "All They Need Is a Chance" (Harvest) CD
This socially conscious track focuses on the tragedy of abortion, reminding the listener that one child saved from this deadly alternative "could change the world." Bright synth production features a delightful children's chorus.

Adult Contemporary

Mylon and Broken Heart de-throne Michael W. Smith as "Jesus It's You" climbs to #1 from #4 last time. Larnelle Harris seems stuck at #2 and may have a tough time keeping up enough steam to take over the top spot. "Healing" by Deniece Williams is the song to watch—it moves all the way to #5 after debuting last time at #14. Other big movers include Jerome Olds and Paul Smith, each of whom jump 17 points to #'s 18 and 19, respectively. (Can't resist pointing out the call-and-response afforded by the positioning of these two titles: Q: "Is it Right?" A: "It's Alright.") D&K's first single from *The Pledge*, "If God Is For Us," is this chart's highest debut at #27. Looks like "The River Will Flow" by White Heart has stalled—it drops three points to #16.

Inspirational

"Your Steadfast Love" remains steadfast at #1, with Larnelle Harris again in the runner-up position. Both of these songs may soon be displaced by Ray Boltz' "Shepherd Boy," which zooms up to #4 after its debut at #21 on the last chart. Still, Boltz needs to accumulate some more points to break through the top three songs, which are separated by only seven points. Truth's "Stand in Awe" is another big mover, going from #17 to #8, as was Tramaine's "The Light Has Come," which moves from #25 to #14. Highest debut is Terri Gibbs' "Unconditional Love."

Contemporary Hits

This multi-format song seems to have found its niche in CHR, where it remains firmly at #1. "The Throne" drops off, as does "Tell Me How You Feel." "In the Valley" (Debbie McClendon) and "Say Once More." Biggest mover is Petra's "Open Book," which goes to #4 from #12. Highest debuts are Kim Boyce's "For Every Lonely Heart" (#7) from her new album and Deniece Williams' "Healing" (#10).

Rock

"I Can, I Will," says Rick Cua, and he did! The Reunion rocker takes over the top spot from The Choir with this arena-ready rave. Another former #1, Allies' "Devil is a Liar," drops six to #9. Biggest mover is Petra's "Counsel of the Holy," which rose 10 to #11, and Mastodon's "This is the Day," which climbed nine to #8. Scarlet Red posts this chart's highest debut with "Don't Dance With Danger."
