RESTRUCTURED GRAMMY GOSPEL CATEGORIES ANNOUNCED

BURBANK, Calif.—The trustees of the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences, Inc. (NARAS), the organization responsible for the Grammy Awards, recently accepted a number of recommendations from the Academy's Awards and Nominations Study Committee, resulting in revisions of its gospel (and other) categories, which was announced last week.

The gospel categories have been restructured, and are now restricted to permit nominations of albums only. Previously, single-song tracks from albums were allowed to compete with album nominations within the same category.

The new categories are as follows: Best Rock/Contemporary Gospel Album; Best Pop Gospel Album; Best Southern Gospel Album; Best Contemporary Soul Gospel Album; Best Traditional Soul Gospel Album; and Best Gospel Album by a Choir or Chorus.

The 33rd Annual Grammy Awards will be held in New York City, and ceremonies will be telecast live on national television from Radio City Music Hall, in late February 1991.

NCPR ELECTS NEW BOARD

NASHVILLE, Tenn.—The National Christian Promoter's Roundtable (NCPR) has recently elected a new board of directors and officers. Paul Emery of Harvest Productions, has been elected president by NCPR members for 1990. Chuck Tilley (Atlantafest) will serve as vice president, and Malcolm Greenwood (Greenwood Productions) will oversee secretarial and treasurer duties. Former NCPR president Justin Smith (Gold Coast Concerts) and former vice president, Jon Robberson of Celebration Concerts, will remain on the five-man board of directors this year.

The NCPR is a recognized division of the Gospel Music Association. The three-year-old organization was formed to improve communication between promoters, increase professionalism, create accountability and establish the legitimacy of the concert promoter within the industry, said Justin Smith. According to Smith, "The NCPR goals are being realized for the first time. This year recorded the highest level of promoter participation in GMA history."

"Our goals this year are simple," commented Emery. "The NCPR aims to facilitate better communication between promoters, agencies, management, and

record companies. In doing so, we will see stronger networks arising that will improve national touring and develop stronger market bases in our industry."

D&K JOINS FORCES WITH RAPHA FOR COUNSELING SUPPORT

NASHVILLE, Tenn.—DeGarmo & Key have taken steps to further minister to those who come to their concerts or buy their products, by making available a counseling service hotline, directly linked to Rapha Counseling Services.

Rapha is a Houston-based organization founded in 1986 by Robert McGee, dedicated to caring for hurting people through a "unique blend of clinical competence and biblical truths that lead to emotional and spiritual healing." Its staff is comprised of Christian psychiatrists, psychologists, certified substance abuse counselors, and program directors.

When an individual calls the Rapha hotline, a assessment referral counselor will move the caller through an evaluation to determine real needs. Options range from referral to the closest local Christian counselor to helping arrange admission to a Rapha treatment center.

Strong entries on the chart this week are David Meece at #20, and The Winans, on yet another chart, with a little assistance from Steve Wonder on "Everyday the Same" which enters at #25.

Contemporary Hits

With only two weeks on the chart, The Winans steamroll to the #1 slot with the rapping "It's Time." This talented ensemble is all over the airwaves and all over the charts. Witness enters at a strong #14 with "Old Landmark."

Inspirational

From the latest trilogy comes this week's #1; Michael Card's retelling of an Old Testament tale, "Where There is Praise" by 4 Him and Karla Worley's "The Way We Praise Him" plow up to the #7 and #8 position.

Rock

My, oh my! Undercover holds on to #1 as Idle Cure and Holy Soldier maintain the #2 and #3 spots, respectively. Adam Again's debut single, "Homeboys," jumps a big 10 slots to #11 and new independent group, the violet burning has strong momentum with "Rise Like the Lion" as it moves to #16. Another independent on the charts, JAG enters at #20 with "21 Reasons." Rap comes to rock as the Winans Brothers enter at #22.

Metal

To no one's surprise, Holy Soldier commands the #1 spot for yet another charting period and its second single, "Tear Down the Walls" enters at a strong #10. "You Get What You Want" off of the new Tourniquet album debuts at an impressive #7.

PICK OF THE WEEK:

Gaither Vocal Band, *A Few Good Men* (Star Song)

The GVB's sixth album builds on their reputation of expertly blending traditional and contemporary elements. They sound as good as ever. The campaign built around the title song includes enormous exposure over the next few months. This should put sales over the top. Also a good tie-in for other products and books for men.

Phil Keaggy, *Find Me in These Fields* (Myrrh)

Keaggy's last two albums (*Sunday's Child* and *Wind and the Wheat*) may have been milestones, but this is his best. This is what many Keaggy fans have been waiting for. *Find Me* mixes the rocking side, the introspective side, the electric and acoustic instrumentals, the masterful guitar breaks, and vintage Keaggy lyrics. With the same band as *Sunday's Child* (Cua, Mead) and guest performances from David Mullen, John Catchings, Charlie Peacock, Phil Madiera, and others, Keaggy leaves the '60s timewarp of the last release, recaptures the flavor of his brilliant work in the '70s, and nails a modern, mature rock production for the '90s. Retailers should be aware that there are many types of Keaggy fans (acoustic, electric, vocal, instrumental). *Find Me* has the best chance of satisfying the broadest scope within that camp.

Noteworthy

Tom Brooks (producer), *Grace* (Integrity Music)

This is the eighth release in Integrity's line of instrumental projects. With this album, Integrity is now calling the series "Interludes." *Grace* features an hour of uninterrupted, soothing instrumental versions of hymns and choruses with the theme of grace. Great for in-store play.

Eric Champion, *Eric Champion* (Myrrh)

Champion is a talented 19-year-old performer from Florida. This promising pop debut showcases Champion's wide-ranging abilities as a singer (with a bit of rap thrown in), songwriting, and producing. Under the direction of Chris Christian, Champion performs upbeat R&B-influenced pop along with layered, synth ballads. Although performed well, those two different styles tend to work against each other and lose focus for the project. This release is apparently targeted to youth, but will probably attract a more yuppie-aged audience. Should appeal to Chris Christian, Bryan Duncan, Morgan Cryar fans.

Morgan Cryar, *Kingdom Upside Down* (Reunion)

Cryar's fourth album returns to his trademark bouncy pop tunes with simple, yet clever lyrics. They couldn't find better producers for this project than Prism's Chris Harris and Mark Heimermann. This release has radio written all over it. Be aware that radio stations are doing a special Father's Day promotion with the song "Father." For Steven Curtis Chapman, Al Denon, and Bryan Duncan fans.

Mark Heard, *Dry Bones Dance* (Fingerprint/Spring Arbor)

This long-awaited release from this accomplished producer/arranger/performer highlights his strengths: introspective songs set to earthy music. Heard focuses on a distinct rockabilly approach for most of this project. In fact, the vocal and musical influence of T-Bone Burnett is unmistakable. You'll also hear vintage Heard-rock in the tradition of *Victims of the Age*. Heard's songs contain strong images of modern life and daily struggles. Should appeal to Burnett, Russ Taff, Garth Hewitt, and Randy Stonehill fans.

Kaiser/Mansfield, *Trimmed & Burnin'* (Grrr/Ocean)

Here are Christian music's two best blues rockers together for the first time on a landmark release of all acoustic, authentic blues. *Trimmed* features classic blues songs from Blind Willie Johnson and the Rev. Gary Davis combined with original songs from Kaiser. The production is stripped down to guitar, dobro, dulcimer, and Mansfield's wailing blues harp. The duo share lead vocal responsibilities on this power release. This first-of-its-kind album will obviously appeal to blues aficionados, and should attract REZ, Mansfield, Larry Howard, Russ Taff, Q Stone, Mark Heard, and Larry Norman fans.

PICKS OF THE WEEK:

Adam Again, "Homeboys" (Broken)

One of Christian music's most poetic and musically expanding groups returns with a new album and single, "Homeboys." Lyrically, Gene Eugene assures that "Homeboys" (neighborhood vernacular of a buddy/close friend) paints pictures that in one way or another we can all associate with, backed by uncompromising rock with a funk twist.

Morgan Cryar, "Father" (Reunion)

With a new record and new sound, Morgan Cryar creates one of his most radio accessible songs in years. Upbeat with bright harmonies—kind of a California sound—Cryar's voice is right at home, guided by the able producing hands of Chris Harris and Mark Heimermann. Perfect for approaching Father's Day.

Randy Stonehill, "Ready to Go" (Myrrh)

The storyteller is back with an upbeat tune off his *Return to Paradise* album. With Stonehill's 20th anniversary in the biz just around the corner, this is a sure thing for a summer hit. Its feel-good harmonies, guitar, and accordion are reminiscent of last summer's anthemic hit "Yahweh is for Us."

The Winans, "Everyday the Same" (Warner Gospel)

Great production, great arrangements—great song. The Winans hits radio-AC this time, with a little help from Stevie Wonder. Mr. Wonder's vocal and harmonica truly soar. These gentlemen are setting quite a standard for themselves and Christian radio.

Noteworthy

Jeffrey Benward, "Set it Into Motion" (Forefront)

A song from Jeffrey Benward that's for AC and CHR formats?!! Okay, Jon Gibson he's not but the title cut from his latest album is a surprisingly upbeat pop tune that makes best use of Benward's smooth vocals and makes you wonder why he didn't do this a long time ago.

Cynthia Clawson, "Oh (How Could I Live Without You)" (DaySpring)

Continuing in the light pop/R&B feel of "Unbelievable" Cynthia Clawson expands her musical style with "Oh..." With a groove that will play as well for CHR or inspirational—not to mention AC, Clawson stretches into some new musical ground.

DeGarmo & Key, "Who Will" (Benson)

With 1.3 million children being murdered each year, D&K felt compelled to respond in song: "Who Will" was born out of the desire to educate and push the topic of abortion to the forefront in our minds and morals. "Who Will" is typical D&K with choir vocals by Christ Church of Nashville for AC/CHR and inspirational formats.

Al Denon, "Reckless Heart" (Benson)

After the success of "Peace Be Still" comes "Reckless Heart" a pop/rhythm-driven tune for AC/CHR with a hooky chorus that will be perfect for the summer.

Benny Hester, "Shall We Gather at the River" (Frontline)

In a truly refreshing change of pace, Benny Hester and Frontline labelmates present the remake of the timeless classic. From the Power Team soundtrack, Hester resists the temptation to overdo the tune and in doing so recreates a song for a new generation of listeners, making this a sweet addition to AC/CHR and inspirational formats.

Nobody Special, "Once One Nation" w/ "Devil Metal" (Broken)

Thrash is back.... Pat Nobody & Co. offer to rock formats "Once One Nation," a lyrical, pounding, non-stop look at the moral decay of a nation that once professed to be "one nation under God." For metalheads comes the satirical and humorous "Devil Metal"—sure to be a hit with the screaming guitars of Frank Wesolek.

Lauren Stalenecker, "Prayerfully" (Frontline)

Lauren Stalenecker creates songs for radio that are tailor-made for AC and inspirational formats. "Prayerfully" is the best to date of what he does: light, easy-listening songs that are encouraging and pleasing to the ears with warm vocals and harmonies.
